

GETTING TO AND AROUND MINNEAPOLIS



THE MINNEAPOLIS/ST. PAUL INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

The Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport - MSP - is 12 miles south of Hyatt Regency Minneapolis. In 2009, MSP was named the Best Large Airport in North America based on Airports Council International - North America's Airport Service Quality traveler survey. MSP has the 12th busiest airfield in the United States and is serviced by fourteen commercial passenger airlines. The recent Delta-Northwest Airlines merger has provided travelers to and from the Minneapolis/St. Paul area with even more flight options as MSP is one of seven Delta hubs and now has service from every domestic airline except JetBlue. The addition of Southwest Airlines has provided another low-cost service option.

GETTING TO HYATT REGENCY MINNEAPOLIS

Travelers can choose from a variety of modes of transportation to get from the Minneapolis/St. Paul International Airport to Hyatt Regency Minneapolis.

- **TRAIN & BUS:** The most inexpensive option is the light rail train system, which departs from the airport every 7-15 minutes. Tickets can be purchased for \$1.75 and are transferable to any bus, enabling travelers to step off the train at Nicollet Mall and hop right on a bus to take them to our front doors!
- **TAXI:** Taxis are commonly available for about \$30 and the trip from the airport to the hotel takes approximately 20 minutes, depending on the time of day and traffic conditions.
- **SUPER SHUTTLE:** Shuttles depart from the airport every 30 minutes on the hour. No reservations are needed. Tickets can be purchased for \$16 per person one-way or \$28 round-trip. SuperShuttle also makes airport stops at Hyatt Regency Minneapolis daily every 30 minutes on the hour from 5am to 5pm or by appointment.

GETTING AROUND MINNEAPOLIS

Metro Transit of Minneapolis and St. Paul operates one of the largest public transportation systems in the country. Metro Transit buses and light-rail trains are clean, fast, and reliable, giving travelers a stress-free way to get where they want to go. Guests of Hyatt Regency Minneapolis need only step outside the front doors to catch a bus on the corner. Fares range from \$1.75 to \$3.00, depending on the time of day. The bus connects to the light rail, allowing travelers to zip across downtown to catch a Twins Baseball or Vikings Football game at the Metrodome or go shopping at the famed Mall of America, the largest indoor shopping and entertainment complex in the U.S.



COMING SOON: FREE NICOLLET MALL BUS SERVICE

In an effort to make downtown travel even more affordable, Metro Transit will soon be unveiling free buses running up and down Nicollet Mall! These new shuttles will enable Hyatt Regency Minneapolis guests to use the bus to get to Nicollet Mall's abundance of shopping, dining, and entertainment as well as the nearby light rail station without paying a penny. Metro Transit also has improvement plans in the works to update bus stations with new signage, seating, and art.

GETTING THERE IS GREEN

Minneapolis' public transportation system is deeply committed to the environment and limits pollution through the use of hybrid buses, which emit 85% fewer particulate emissions and have 28% better fuel efficiency. They are powered by a combination of electricity and 10% biodiesel, which produces cleaner exhaust than petrodiesel. Light rail trains run on entirely on electricity and are 100% emission-free.
